Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority Franklin Lakes Sanitary Sewer Supplemental Loan Project

Dear Mr. Hurwitz:

The Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority (NBCUA) has constructed a new sanitary sewer pump station, force main and gravity collection system to service the commercial/business district area in the Borough of Franklin Lakes along Franklin Avenue between Pulis Avenue and just west of Route 287 and Susquehanna. Presently, properties within this area are primarily serviced via existing small package treatment plants or individual septic systems. They can now be connected to the new system.

NBCUA previously received \$5,127,721 in New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Financing Program (NJEIFP) loans for the above work. During project construction, there was additional work associated with this project which was outside the scope of the original project and requires supplemental loan funding.

A description of the additional work includes lowering 595 LF of 8" gravity sewer on Susquehanna Avenue and 1570 LF of 10" gravity sewer on Pulis Avenue; installation of a 3" force main (575 LF) on Pulis Avenue to the front of Mountain Shadows at Linden Road; raising 366 LF of the Franklin Avenue 8" gravity sewer under the railroad (due to a United Water main conflict); extending the length of 8" gravity sewer pipe by approximately 235 LF along Susquehanna to Pulis Avenue; eliminating a section of 8" gravity sewer at the upstream end of Franklin Avenue (approximately 335 LF); modifications to the new pump station resulting from relocation to an easement in lieu of using the existing lot and building; and extension of the new 8" gravity sewer 110 LF south on Pulis Ave under the railroad tracks to Tice Lane. The project cost for these changes is \$475,000.

NBCUA is working with the NJEIFP on financing for the above additional work. Construction costs plus costs associated with engineering, administration and planning and design will be financed through a low interest loan from the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust

WHEREAS, the Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority intends to file a loan application with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust for the Authority's Incinerator Improvements:

The proposed project includes various upgrades and improvements to the Authority's two (2) existing incinerators. Proposed work includes upgrades to the existing Niro and IDI incinerator units to meet upcoming EPA air emission limits (40CFR60 Subpart-MMMM). These improvements consist of retro-fitting both units with caustic addition to the wet scrubbers to improve SO₂ removal efficiency, and the addition of fixed bed sulfur impregnated activated carbon adsorbers (and associated ancillary systems) to remove mercury from the exhaust. Major ductwork modifications and valve installations will also be required to complete the proposed work, as well as, a new platform to house the equipment. Other improvements include replacement in kind of the corroded ductwork and plenums on the IDI incinerator.
