Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority Incinerator Emissions Upgrade Loan Project

Dear Mr. Hurwitz:

The Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority (NBCUA) owns and operates two fluidized bed sewage sludge incineration systems. The southernmost unit was designed by Niro Atomizer, Inc. (Niro), and installed in 1987. The northernmost unit was designed by Infilco Degremont, Inc. (IDI), installed in 1998 and is identifiable by its stainless steel shell. Both existing systems include a fluidized bed incinerator with a combustion chamber, a fluidizing air preheater, a windbox or over bed burner systems and a venturi scrubber with cooling tower leading to a shared wet electrostatic precipitator and exhaust stack. In addition, the IDI incinerator system contains a secondary heat exchanger for plume suppression.

To comply with new regulations for existing (40 CFR 60 – Subpart MMMM) fluid bed sewage sludge incinerators (SSI), within the margin of average operation, NBCUA will require additional air pollution control (APC) equipment and/or equipment modifications to further reduce mercury and sulfur dioxide (SO₂) emissions. As part of the Incinertor Emissions Upgrade project we propose the following work for the removal of Mercury and SO₂, which is proposed to occur in separate control devices. For control of mercury emission, a fixed bed activated carbon adsorber (including instrumentation and ancillary systems) will be installed on a platform constructed above the lower road immediately behind the operations building. Sulfur dioxide (SO₂) removal will occur by absorption of the acid gas in water assisted by the on-demand addition of caustic (NaOH) to the packed bed under the WESP, and on the cooling tower trays. The remaining regulated components (Cd, CO, HCl, NOx, Pb, CDD/CDF, PM) passed within <75% of their respective limit, and thus are considered satisfactory.

To ensure that the mercury adsorber remain free of condensed water at all times, the exhaust gases entering the adsorber will be preheated. The IDI unit's existing secondary heat exchanger will be repurposed to reheat the scrubbed exhaust gases. However, the NIRO incinerator design will require the addition of a new secondary heat exchanger. Due to the complexity of



the system, proper operation of the new system will be ensured by automating and fully integrating the new system into the existing incinerator control system. Various dampers, valves, induced draft fan, and ancillary equipment will also be automated, interlocked and, alarmed to alert operators.

Additional system repairs during the upgrade include replacement of a majority of the IDI incinerator plenums and ductwork Due to corrosion and breakthrough of the original steel shells.

The NBCUA has submitted a funding application through the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Financing Program (NJEIFP) and is working with them to finance the work noted above. Construction costs plus costs associated with engineering, administration and planning and design will be financed through a low interest loan from the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust (NJEIT) and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), pursuant to NJEIFP guidelines. The NBCUA has passed a resolution authorizing application to the Local Finance Board for financing associated with the NJEIFP program.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE DECLARATION OF OFFICIAL INTENT UNDER TREASURY REGULATION SECTION 1.150-2 TO REIMBURSE PRIOR EXPENDITURES RELATED TO VARIOUS SEWER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority (the "Authority") intends to issue debt obligations, the interest on which is excluded from gross income under Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and that will be used to finance various sewer improvements, including upgrades and improvements to the Authority's two existing incinerators (the debt obligations herein referred to as "Project Debt Obligations" herein referred to as the "Project");

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to finance the Project, in part, with the Project Debt Obligations but may pay for certain costs of the Project ("Project Costs") prior to the issuance of the Project Debt Obligations with funds of the Authority which are not borrowed funds;

WHEREAS, the Authority desires to preserve its rights to treat an allocation of proceeds of the Project Debt Obligations to the reimbursement of Project Costs paid by the Authority prior to the issuance of the Project Debt Obligations as an expenditure for such Project Costs to be reimbursed for purposes of Sections 103 and 141-150 of the Code.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Authority as follows:

- **Section 1.** The Authority reasonably expects to reimburse its expenditure of Project Costs paid prior to the issuance of the Project Debt Obligations with proceeds of its Project Debt Obligations.
- **Section 2.** This resolution is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the Authority's official intent to reimburse the Authority for expenditure of Project Costs by the Authority paid prior to the issuance of the Project Debt Obligations with the proceeds of the Project Debt Obligations, in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section 150-2.
- **Section 3.** The maximum principal amount of the Project Debt Obligations expected to be issued to finance the Project is \$8,500,000.

Section 4. The Project Costs to be reimbursed with the proceeds of the Project Debt Obligations will be "capital expenditures" in accordance with the meaning of Section 150 of the Code.

Section 5. No reimbursement allocation will employ an "abusive arbitrage device" under Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-10 to avoid the arbitrage restrictions or to avoid the restrictions under Sections 142 through 147 of the Code. The proceeds of the Project Debt Obligations used to reimburse the Authority for Project Costs, or funds corresponding to such amounts, will not be used in a manner that results in the creation of "replacement proceeds", including "sinking funds", "pledged funds", or funds subject to a "negative pledge" (as such terms are defined in Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1) of the Project Debt Obligations or another issue of debt obligations of the Authority, other than amounts deposited into a "bona fide debt service fund" (as defined in Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1).

Section 6. All reimbursement allocations will occur not later than 18 months after the later of: (i) the date the expenditure from a source other than the Project Debt Obligations is paid; or (ii) the date the Project is "placed in service" (within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2) or abandoned, but in no event more than 3 years after the expenditure is paid.

Section 7. This resolution will take effect immediately.
